What is Arizona's Children Association?

Arizona's Children Association was originally founded in 1912, as Arizona Children's Home Association, to care for homeless, neglected and dependent children. For more than 98 years the agency has stayed true to its mission of Protecting Children and Preserving Families, and now serves more than 45,000 children and their families in all 15 counties in the state each year. Programs and services include foster and kinship care, adoption, crisis nursery, family support and preservation, counseling, substance abuse and sexual abuse treatment, special education school, early childhood education, Head Start, adult education, preventive health and fitness and a Community Center.

Who can attend the After-School and Day Program?

The AzCA after-school and day program is designed for 1st to 9th graders in Pima County with emotional and behavioral needs. Classes operate on a one-to-five ratio in order to give children the individual attention they need. Participants must be referred by their behavioral health network or their school.



Our Program

The Arizona's Children Association after-school and day program provides social and self management skills in a supervised and structured setting for children with emotional and behavioral needs. Students are challenged to address social situations and develop appropriate, positive coping strategies.

This unique and effective summer day camp experience is focused on social skill building through activities such as Homework Help, Health and Fitness, Survival Cooking, Off Campus Activities, Art/photography, Computers and Games. The AzCA campus features a swimming pool and air conditioned gym.

After-School

The Arizona's Children Association after-school program is the only one of its kind in Pima County. The daily schedule includes homework help time, snacks, art or gym time and an optional IM sports program.

Therapeutic Day Program

The daily schedule includes a variety of therapeutic groups, guest speakers from the community, educational support and therapeutic recreational activities. Curriculum topics include peer and family relationships, identifying and expressing feelings and increasing self esteem. Breakfast and lunch are provided.

Program Goals

- Improve social skills through therapeutic exercises, group discussions, activities and tutoring.
- Teach healthy living skills such as good hygiene, manners and appropriate boundaries.
- Help students make progress toward designated therapeutic and IEP goals.
- Help children demonstrate improvement in identifying and positively expressing feelings, resulting in less disruptive and more compliant behavior.

Our Staff

The AzCA after-school and day program supervisor is a master's level therapist. The supervisor can facilitate child and family team meetings as needed. Additionally, the program staff is trained in behavioral techniques and is dedicated to helping students meet the goals of the referral source.
